

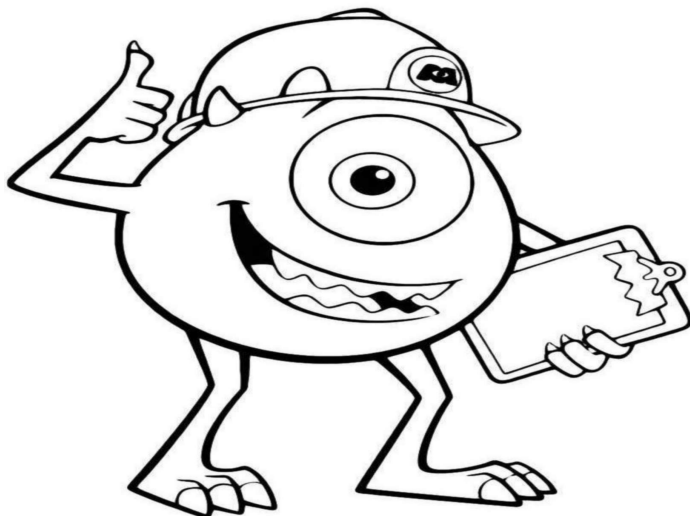

Class ----- Description

- 4) A torn paper summer picture

B. Ages 5 to 8 years. (at fair time)

- 5) Make an animal using a toilet tissue roll
- 6) On construction paper, make a tractor with buttons
- 7) Splatter painting
- 8) Fingerprint art picture
- 9) Paint a stone
- 10) Make a suncatcher
- 11) Using found items in nature, create a picture
- 12) Make a paper bag kite
- 13) Make a fridge magnet

Special:

- 14) Build a Lego House.

- 15) Choose a word to describe “volunteers”, use bubble letters to write your word and then decorate
- 16) Make a musical instrument

Class ----- Description

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A. Ages 5 years and under. (at fair time)

- 45) Carrot made out of play dough on a paper plate.
- 46) An odd, shaped vegetable.
- 47) Smallest tomato.
- 48) A coloured drawing of your garden.

B. Ages 6 to 8 years. (at fair time)

- 49) Biggest bloom – 1 single bloom in a jar of water.
- 50) Something interesting from nature (rock, fungi, etc.).
- 51) Shortest bean.
- 52) A collage of garden vegetables – mounted on 8 ½” x 11” bristol board.

C. Ages 9 to 12 years. (at fair time).

- 53) 3 different flowers of the same colour – can be wild or tame.
- 54) Pencil sketch a vegetable from your garden – not coloured.
- 55) Largest tomato.
- 56) Design a zucchini vehicle.

D. Ages 13 to 16 years. (at fair time)

- 57) Make a small wildflower center piece for the kitchen table.
- 58) Identify a weed in your garden – mounted on 8½” x 11” bristol board, include name and description.
- 59) A plate of 3 vegetables from your garden.
- 60) List some ways that climate change may affect your garden. (Minimum 3/maximum 6, in list form)

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A. Ages 5 years and under. (at fair time)

- 61) Draw a picture of a barn.
- 62) Tallest stalk of corn (no roots).
- 63) Make a face mask of your favourite farm animal.
- 64) Your pet made from play dough.

B. Ages 6 to 8 years. (at fair time)

- 65) Draw a picture of a scare crow.
- 66) Best photo of your favorite farm pet.
- 67) A small farm animal made out seeds on a plate – name the animal.
- 68) Display a mystery item found on your farm.

C. Ages 9 to 12 years. (at fair time).

- 69) A small antique found on the farm.
- 70) A soybean plant with the most pods.
- 71) A pencil sketch of wildlife you might see on your farm.

D. Ages 13 to 16 years. (at fair time).

- 72) Nail punch a tin can - make a tea light (*for safety reasons fill the can with water and freeze, then punch).
- 73) Make a corn husk doll.
- 74) 3 ears of grain corn.
